LAYING A NEW LAWN and HANGING BASKET success

I would firstly like to show my admiration and congratulate you on all your hard work and devotion to such a globally important and under estimated cause. If only we could get more people to realise the importance of your research the earth really could be a more stable place to live!!

My own horticultural experiences of using SEER ROCKDUST is as follows.

In May 2004 I completely striped my lawn of all vegetation **and prepared a seed bed to lay a lawn / putting green.** I then obtained some seed from my golf course green keeper, he told me to sow the seed and cover in sand. This is when I had the idea of using SEER ROCKDUST instead.

So I then sowed the seed as normal but covered it with about 5 mm of SEER ROCKDUST instead of silver sand. I must say that I have been completely amazed with the results. In the first year my gardener reported the grass needed cutting a little more often than before. (Thanks Cammy!) But the quality of the lawn is amazing. I invited the green keeper up to inspect it and he was amazed with the quality and the lack of maintenance it needed to get it that way! In the second year it got even better and now I am considering re-laying my parent's lawns in the same way

I also achieved **the best hanging baskets I have ever had** by mixing the remaining SEER ROCKDUST with topsoil, worms and all. Using that as my sole growing medium also saved me money!
