We first became interested in SEER Rockdust after a visit up to the SEER Centre in 2004.

It was nothing short of amazing to see all these superb vegetables being produced in blooming good health when all around them was nothing but gorse, sheep and open moor. Cammie's explanations about mineral loss from the soil because it is so long since the last glaciation, about rockdust putting minerals back into the soil (and the vegs) and at the same time take carbon out of the atmosphere made us decide it was worth giving it a go.

We are in the process of turning what was originally sheep grazing farmland into a small market garden where we can produce naturally grown vegetables to supply the local market. We have been Members of the **Wholesome Food Association** since 2005 and, since we saw this totally natural product in line with the purposes of the Association, we arranged to get a bulk load and have been using it ever since.

Whilst we cannot prove it, because we never carried out any with-and-without trials, we are in little doubt that the SEER Rockdust, used alongside the natural manure has played an important part in producing vegetables that quite exceed our expectations. Something must be going right!

We also noted the areas in and around where the SEER Rockdust has been applied show far more worm casts, ie worm activity, than areas without.

Yes, we are converts to SEER Rockdust and have now taken on a stock of the 20kg bags and 4kg buckets to sell onto our customers. Keep up the good work SEER – there is great deal more you can do for us all.
